

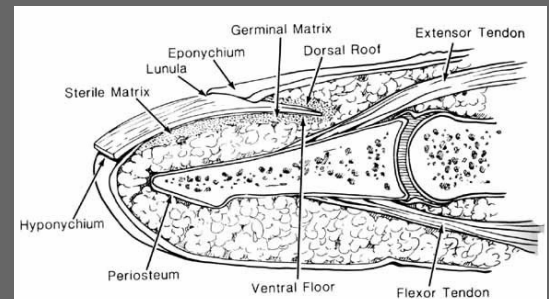

NINJA in the new year

As we begin to roll out NINJA across the UK, we will be visiting each of the sites to talk to the clinical and research staff about NINJA and addressing site-specific practical and logistical issues. Subject to favourable review from the ethics committee, we intend to start these site initiation visits in January 2018.



At each visit, staff will be encouraged to engage with the central NINJA team and we will be demonstrating and teaching the trial-specific skills needed, such as electronic data capture, to record participant details and randomise. This will free up site staff time and making the trial as user-friendly as possible.

NINJA Trial manager appointed

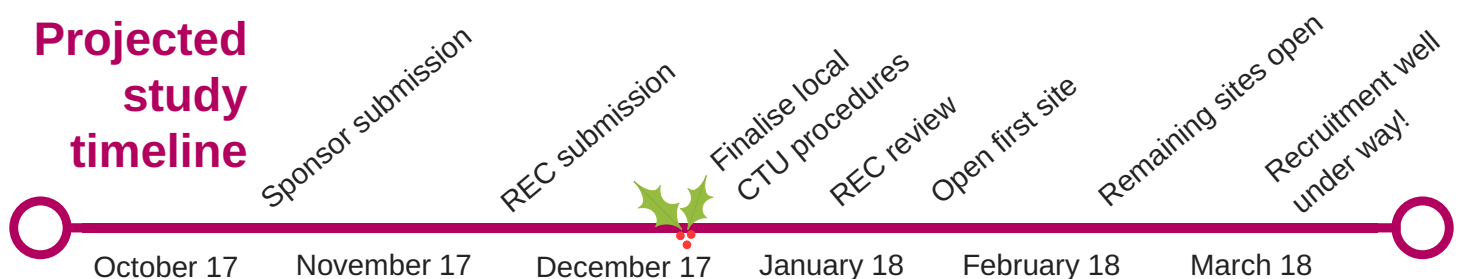


We have sites chomping at the bit to start recruiting, and there's a lot that's been happening behind the scenes to make that a reality!
